# **Parental Expectations**

It has been brought to my attention that adults occasionally have been overheard swearing or using inappropriate language on the playgrounds whilst waiting to drop off or pick up children. This is clearly unacceptable as there are younger siblings nearby or children waiting to enter school themselves. Please be aware that adults can be prevented from being on school premises if their conduct does not support the values and ethos of the school and please do support us in modelling good manners and language in front of the children. ### **Consultations and Questionnaires**

It was good to see so many of you at our recent parent consultation evenings. I hope you found the conversations with your child's teacher useful and supportive. Thank you to everyone who completed a parental questionnaire during consultations. In total 111 were completed and this accounted for 191 children in the school which is 65% of school. I have collated the responses and attached them to this letter. Not all responses total 111 as not all questions were answered every time. We continue to be very encouraged by your positive views of the school and will continue to do everything to work with you and provide a great place for your children to learn. #### **Robinwood Residential**

Mrs Scaife, Miss Shadforth and Mrs Moore had another fabulous residential trip, this time to Baraugh Hall in Alston. They took a great group of Year 5 and Year 6 children and they have all commented on the excellent behaviour and attitudes of the children who got stuck into the activities. We will hold a celebration assembly in the next few weeks when we will share the photos and stories of what they got up to with parents and KS2 children. # Y2 & Y6 SATs/Y1 Phonics Screening

We are getting closer to the annual test weeks in May which means that children in Year 6 and Year 2 are preparing particularly hard. Children in Year 1 will also undertake the phonics screening check during a week in June. These tests are not the total measure of any child as there is so much more to every individual that can't be reported as a scaled

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score or written down in a test. We don't want the children to be worried or stressed about tests but to see them as an extension of all their usual classwork – an opportunity even to show off how much they have learned!

- Year 6 Test Week is Monday 11<sup>th</sup> May until Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> May.
- Year 2 will be taking their tests throughout May as part of everyday lessons.
- Year 1 will take the phonics screening check in the week commencing 8<sup>th</sup> June.

We obviously want to help the children do their very best and therefore we ask that you continue to make every effort to ensure your child has excellent attendance and punctuality over the coming weeks. This will ensure that they do not miss out on important learning in relation to these assessments. Thank you.
