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Non Screen Activities	
Activity	Helpful tips
Find the names of the baby farmyard animals. What do you call a baby... Cow? Sheep? Goat? Chicken? Horse? Duck? Dog	Try drawing pictures of the pairs, then turn them over to play a memory matching game!
Can you make a list of machinery that you might find on a farm? Do you know what it is used for?	Try thinking about what the animals and crops on the farm might need, e.g. water / food
Take ten objects (spoons are a good idea) and put them in a line. Roll a dice and take away that many. Take them away starting from the right hand side, like counting backwards on a number line.	Remember slow and careful counting.
Make a number line from 1-10. Put an object (like a Lego man) on number 10. Roll the dice again and make the Lego man hop back that many times. What number does he land on? Is it the same as when you were taking away the spoons?	Remember to move and count at the same time. Don't count a hop before you have moved!
Can you make a sheep out of cotton wool?	A cardboard tube is quite a good shape for the body.
