Activity	Helpful tips
<p><u>Maths</u> Use a pack of cards, make some if you need to. Deal out the cards and multiply the numbers together. You can play with as many or few people as you want.</p>	<p>You could write the sums and answers to help you and then count to show your answers at the same time.</p>
<p><u>English</u> Write a diary entry for each day and include a subordinating conjunction each day. Try to use at least: because, when, since, although.</p>	<p>Remember to use other things such as capital letters and full stops or question marks.</p>
<p><u>Reading</u> Write a summary of the book you are reading or have just read. It should be up to a page long. Do not rewrite the book, just write the main points. Try to write one sentence about each main point of a story mountain to guide what to write about.</p>	<p>Think about a story mountain. 5 parts – characters, setting, build-up, problem/action, resolution, ending. Remember adjectives, adverbs too!</p>
<p><u>Science</u> Can you write down lots of different creatures? Make a list of as many as you can think of and then, decide how you can sort them. What groups would you make? How can you show the groups and would any belong to more than one group?</p>	<p>We have used different sorting methods, tables, venn diagrams and lists. To group things, they have to have something the same.</p>
<p><u>Art</u> Find a picture of an animal. It can be a pet or one you see out of the window. Draw what you think would be the skeleton of that animal and then draw it as you see it. It should have the same shape.</p>	<p>Use a pencil and sketch first to get an overall outline before you add detail.</p>
