


Keeping Busy at Home – Year 5B & C

<p>Maths In class, we learnt our factors using factor rainbows. Can you choose 6 numbers within 100 and draw their factor rainbows? You could even put them in your window when you are done!</p> 	<p>A factor is a number that when multiplied with another, gives a value called a multiple.</p> <p>For example, 4 and 5 are factors of the multiple 20 because when we multiply them together we get 20.</p>
<p>Writing The relative pronouns are that, which, who, whom and whose and they help add relative clauses to a sentence. Can you write one sentence for each pronoun? Can you write a paragraph that includes them all?</p>	<p>Relative clauses add extra information about the noun, e.g. The lollipop lady, <u>who held up the stop sign</u>, allowed us cross the road safely.</p>
<p>Geography In Autumn, we learnt about the topographical features of a place. Have a think about what topographical features there are in Hemlington (I can think of one very large oval feature you can walk around).</p> <p>Could you write these down or even plot them on a hand-drawn map of Hemlington?</p>	<p>Topographical features are things such as hills, rivers, woodland, coastline, farmland (rural) and built up areas (urban).</p>
<p>DT There have been lots of news stories about protective clothing (PPE) worn by doctors and nurses during the Covid-19 pandemic. Can you design a protective outfit for our NHS and key workers?</p>	<p>Remember to label your design and explain what each part does to protect the person wearing it.</p>
<p>RE Muslims following the Islamic faith are currently observing the holy month of Ramadan (fasting). We studied this when we looked at the Five Pillars of Islam, fasting being the fourth pillar called Sawm.</p> <p>Can you create a fact poster or leaflet to explain what Sawm/Ramadan is?</p>	<p><u>Key facts:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ramadan is the month of fasting. - During Ramadan, Muslims do not eat or drink during daylight hours. - It happens in the 9th month of the Islamic calendar. - Muslims feel it teaches self- control and a better understanding of Allah's (God's) gifts.
