<p>Maths task Access week 2 lesson 5-arrays. Watch the video and try the activities to remind yourself what an array is. This is something we have done but found quite tricky. Remember you can pause the video as you go.</p>
<p>English Listen to the story of Sam's sandwich, told by Miss Brown (it's super funny). Listen carefully as there are some questions to answer at the end! Once you have done this can you retell the story? It would be a good idea to make notes as you listen, and a top tip would be, listen to it once and then rewind and listen again to make sure you don't miss anything!</p>

<p>Science Find out about the parts of a plant and what they do – roots, stem, leaf, flower, petal, trunk, branch, bark. Maybe you could plant some seeds of your own and keep a diary, recording how it grows. 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<p>Phonics Go on to phonics play and practise your blending by playing buried treasure or dragon's den. These are games we play every day in school so you know what to do and this will help to refresh you on sounds we have learned so far this year.</p>	<p>https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/ Username: march20 Password: home</p>	<p>Ask an adult to listen to you sounding and blending the words. If you finish these quickly why not have a go at reading some of the sentences to get some extra practise.</p>

Activity	Helpful tips
<p>Physical Task Invent your own 15-minute workout routine and share it with someone in your house.</p>	<p>Think about Joe Wicks PE sessions can you use some of his moves? Remember to warm up and stretch your muscles first.</p>
<p>Science Can you draw an animal and its habitat? Remember the work we did in school on this? Where does a duck live? Where does a lion live? Think about why a lion wouldn't live on a farm or in our house! This will remind you what its habitat would be like.</p>	<p>Do you have any books about animals that might help you? Do you have a pet? What does their habitat look like? E.g. fish-tank, hamster-cage.</p>
<p>Writing Can you write a set of instructions? Make yourself a sandwich and write instructions for someone to follow to make the sandwich for themselves. What do you need to make your sandwich? Remember to write a list of what they will need first before you write the instructions. Use time adverbials: first, then, next, after that, finally. Then you can eat your sandwich yum!</p>	<p>As you make your sandwich write down each instruction, so you don't leave anything out!</p>
<p>Maths Make yourself some number cards to 20. Pick to and do a calculation. It could be adding them together or taking away. Can you do 10 calculations?</p>	<p>You will need a pencil, paper and scissors.</p>
<p>Art Make an observational drawing or painting of a plant. Think about shapes, patterns, textures, details and colours. Do you have any pictures in your house that you could copy? Are there any pretty flowers in your garden you could use?</p>	<p>You will need: paper, pencil, crayons/paint.</p>
