


Keeping Busy at Home – Reception

Non Screen Activities	
Activity	Helpful tips
<p>Go on a minibeast hunt outside! Under the bushes, creeping through the grass, resting on leaves... What can you find?</p>	<p>Remember to observe social distancing if you venture beyond the garden.</p>
<p>Go for a minibeast hunt inside! Under the stairs, behind the cupboard, in those dark corners... What can you find?</p>	<p>Can you make a chart to compare what is the same and different for your inside and outside hunt?</p>
<p>Sorting activity: Look at the minibeasts you found on your hunt. How can you sort them? E.g. Has got wings / has not got wings Is black / is not black</p>	<p>You could draw pictures of the minibeast on each side of your sorting chart as well as labelling them.</p>
<p>Make a spider out of what resources you have.</p>	<p>Remember: spiders have 8 legs and live in webs!</p>

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Use Mrs Brown's Playdough (see above for the recipe) to create your own minibeast! Can you make a whole family?

Remember to try to keep both sides of your minibeast symmetrical.
