Activity	Helpful tips
<p>Maths Practice writing out your numbers to 20 forwards <u>and</u> backwards. How quickly can you say them? Get an adult to time you. For an extra challenge, see if you can do the same with your numbers to 50 or even 100!</p>	<p>It might help if you use your finger and tap each number as you say it.</p>
<p>Writing Recently we have had lots of mixed weather. Have a look outside and see what the weather is doing. Is it sunny? Is it raining? Write about the weather and use adjectives to describe. You could also draw a picture based on your description.</p>	<p>You might want to write adjectives down first while you look outside, then put these into sentences.</p>
<p>Reading Choose a favourite story book you have at home. Read your book and make a list of the characters who appear in the story. Then see if you can make some character masks. <p>Science How did you get on with last week's lesson on animal groups? On your daily walk make a note of the different animals you see e.g. dogs, ladybirds, sparrows etc. When you get home, see if you can draw these animals and say which group they fit into.</p> <p>The groups are: <i>Amphibian, Birds, Fish, Mammals, Minibeasts, Reptiles</i></p>	<p>You will need: pencil, paper, crayons.</p>
<p>Wellbeing Task Make a calming area in your house where you can relax. Add cushions, a favourite book, music or cuddly toys. Go there and have some time to relax once a day or when you feel overwhelmed.</p>	<p>Make sure you ask permission from an adult before moving things or taking items into your calm space.</p>
