



<p>Writing</p> <p>I found this image really intriguing. Can you write a short piece of narrative (story) inspired by the picture? How many sentence types can you use?</p> 	<p>Possible sentence types that we have used in class:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Fronted adverbial (place and manner) - Simile - Personification - Relative clause sentence - Subordinate conjunction sentence - Repeated adjective sentence - Expanded noun phrase
<p>Science</p> <p>The weather looks pretty wet this week. Before we left school, we were looking at the properties of materials. Think about the differences between impermeable (waterproof) and absorbent (absorbs liquid).</p> <p>Can you conduct an experiment to test the permeability and absorbency of some household items? Can you then sort the items into the two groups?</p>	<p>Use a table to record findings.</p> <p>Find a way to display your findings e.g. a bar chart, photos, a Venn diagram.</p>
<p>RE</p> <p>In January we asked the question 'Why do some people think God exists?' Write down what you can remember about this topic. You can display this information as creatively as you want.</p>	<p>We discussed theist, atheist and agnostic as well as discussing images of God.</p>
