## WINTER WEATHER

The school heating system is on and so if your child is feeling particularly cold they should let their teacher know.

# LOCKDOWN RESTRICTIONS REMINDER

Here is a reminder of the restrictions currently in place until 2nd December. Please ensure that you follow these in order to protect our community, and the wider town, as much as possible.

- Stay at home (you should only go out to buy essential items, for education or medical needs, to visit people in your support bubble or child care bubble) You can not go in the home of anyone else.
- You should not meet other people socially. You can exercise outside with people you live with, your support bubble or 1 person from another household.
- You cannot meet in private gardens of other people, unless you have formed a support bubble with them.
- Most children previously classed as clinically extremely vulnerable do not need to shield this time. If you are unsure, please speak to your GP or specialist clinician.
