TIER 2 and WHAT IT MEANS

Currently Middlesbrough and the wider Tees Valley are part of Tier 2 Covid restrictions. Here is a reminder of what that means for us all.

- You are not allowed to have people into your house that do not live with you.
- You are no longer allowed to visit anyone else's home.
- You can only go to a pub, restaurant, or any indoor setting with people you live with. You cannot socialise with anyone from another house at any indoor setting.
- Social distancing is still very important and must be in place.
- The 10pm curfew is still in place.
- You can meet up to 6 people outside e.g a private garden or public place such as a park.

We understand that children would normally like to play together outside school, particularly over the holiday, but these rules do mean that they should not do so. They should also not have sleepovers or parties in the coming weeks.

<u>Please ensure that you keep to these rules for the safety of yourselves and the school community.</u>
