ATTENDANCE—A SCHOOL PRIORITY

Attendance at Viewley Hill is a priority this year and so it is important that your child attends every day. Over the course of the last year children have missed much time in school and so being in school every day is vital to support their individual catch up and progress.

We will be doing lots to reward good attendance on a weekly and termly basis, as well first day contact for children not in school.

AUTUMN 1 LEARNING NEWSLETTER

At the end of this week your child will bring home a newsletter about what your child has to look forward to in school this half term. This will inform you about their learning and how you can help them at home too. Please ask if you have any questions.

COVID MEASURES

As you are aware many of the Covid protective measures are no longer a requirement. It is very important to us however, that you as our school community feel safe on our school site. These measures continue to be in place within school:

- Ventilation in all rooms is still in place with windows open
- Tables continue to be cleaned each morning and the end of the school day
- Children continue to wash their hands at different points of the day
- Staff in school will continue to complete regular testing
- School continues to keep a record of positive tests and will take Public Health England advice if necessary

COVID SYMPTOMS & TESTING

If you or your child has Covid symptoms it is important that you arrange for a PCR test.

You must also book a PCR test if you have a positive LFD test.

You must isolate until you have the PCR results.

PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOU INFORM US IF YOUR CHILD TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID 19.

IT IS IMPORTANT WE HAVE THIS INFORMATION IN ORDER TO KEEP OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY SAFE.

COVID ISOLATION

It is no longer a requirement to isolate if you live with, or have been a close contact to someone who tests positive for Covid-19.

Unless children test positive themselves, or you have had other advice from NHS Track and Trace, all children should be at school every day.

HOME LEARNING

For any children who are required to isolate, we will continue to provide home learning.

Most of this learning will be through SeeSaw.

Please speak to your child's teacher or email school if you need a reminder of login details.
